We are collecting the following items to help us with dollars that can supply many of our needs.




We are still collecting the Box Tops For Education. We received a large number of these just from the tissues that were brought in by the students at the beginning of the year. We are collecting ink cartridges for kids. If you have a printer, we will accept your empty cartridges. We send them to a company that will refill and resell them. Keep us in mind for those cartridges you would otherwise throw away.



Mr. K's is now a Best Choice Brand store. We are collecting the UPC codes off their items. You will not need to cut off the whole label, but just the bar code with its information. We will send these into the company to receive a set amount. They will give us \$0.03 per code. We need to send them in periodically.



Last, but not least we are a drop off spot for old batteries. We are not able to recycle them, but we act as representative for the community to help keep these items from going in the regular waste. We take them to the land fill to have them disposed of environmentally safe.
