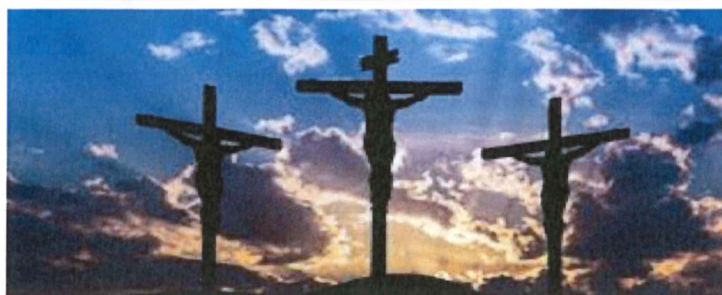

Intercessory prayer

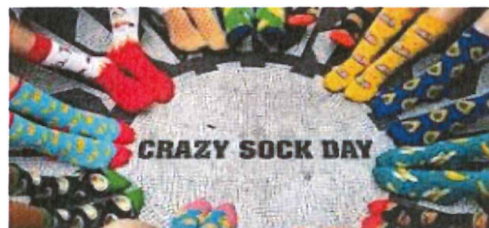

A Note from the Principal

We are drawing close to the end of school as we begin our last nine weeks.

These last few months will go by fast and we have a lot to cover. In April, the 3rd through 5th grade will take their Kansas Assessments. These tests, like the Iowa Basics, are used by the school to examine where we need to adjust curriculum for the students. We will also take the ARK test, which is an assessment of Religion knowledge. It is taken in Kindergarten through 5th grade.

The end of the year is not only about testing. We will also have some fun. All the teachers are thinking about where to go for year-end field trips. Kindergarten – 5th grade will also make a trip to the Kansas Wetlands to expand on what they learned earlier when the Wetlands Education Director was here in January. Also, 3rd–5th will take their annual trip to Lenora for the Ameritowne adventure learning about what makes a town work.

So as you can see, it will be a fast, furious, and fun time until we reach the end.
