"Glad tidings do we bring!"

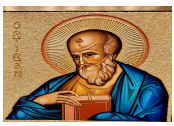
A bright star lit the heavens,

## St. John the Apostle

St. John the Apostle is known for being the "beloved disciple" of Jesus, writing the Gospel of John, three epistles, and the Book of Revelation, and for being entrusted by Jesus to care for his mother, Mary. He was the only apostle to stay with Jesus during the crucifixion and is traditionally considered the last surviving apostle who died of natural causes. He is also associated with [Patmos](#), where he was exiled and received his visions for the Book of Revelation. He is believed to be the only apostle who lived a full life and died of natural causes, likely in Ephesus around the year 100. His feast day is December 27<sup>th</sup>. Because of his teachings in his epistles, particularly his emphasis on love as a central tenet of Christianity, he is often called the "Apostle of Love".
